Brisbane has an estimated 350 people who are sleeping rough in our city. Living in such conditions puts the health of these men, women and children at great risk.

**50 Lives 50 Homes** is a campaign to identify, house and support the fifty most vulnerable homeless people in Brisbane. We need your help to make sure we find them.

From 7 – 11 June we'll canvas the city early in the morning as Brisbane is waking up and survey the people we find sleeping in public spaces. The survey results will give vital information about the health of the people living on our streets so that those in most need of housing and support can be prioritised.

We need 50 volunteers to join the teams in conducting the surveys and we need the people of Brisbane to get behind the campaign.

**50 Lives 50 Homes** is being led by a number of government and non government agencies providing support to homeless people sleeping rough in public spaces. These agencies are working in partnership to achieve a comprehensive survey of Brisbane's rough sleeping population. The project will be assisted by leading experts on health among the homeless from Boston and New York City.
